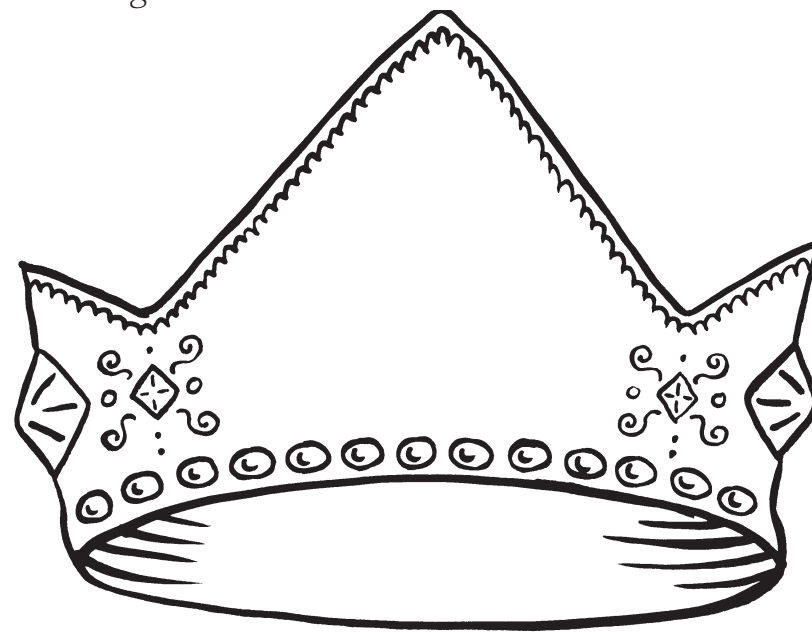

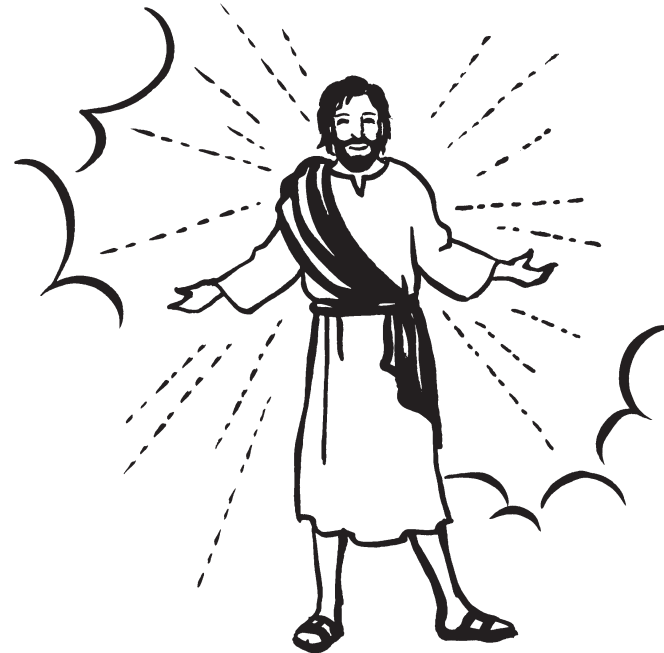
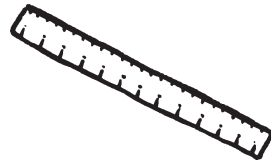
Jesus, our ruler
